LABOR DAY PAID HOLIDAY

Labor Day, Monday, September 7, 2026, is a paid holiday. Only registered members who have 800 qualifying hours in the prior payroll year (2025) and meet the availability requirement for at least two of the five days Monday through Friday (exclusive of the holiday) will receive a paid holiday for Labor Day. This means you must work or meet the availability requirements for at least two of these days, Tuesday, September 8th; Wednesday, September 9th; Thursday, September 10th; and Friday, September 11, 2026.

LABOR DAY IS ONE OF THE HOLIDAYS THAT EVERYONE HAS TO MEET THE TWO DAY AVAILABILITY REQUIREMENT

Persons taking vacation during the holiday week must report the vacation to the Records Clerk in the Dispatch Hall on or before Friday, September 11, 2026, or you will not receive the holiday pay.

Persons not receiving holiday pay because of illness, injury, jury duty, etc., must file a claim with the Records Clerk on or before Friday, October 23, 2026.

The Labor Day holiday pay will be paid on Friday, September 18, 2026

Some paid holiday notes:

- Vacation must be taken Monday through Friday
- To be made available means you cannot pass a job in your skill or category or a clerk job

- Two shifts in one day only counts as one day working. (Example: *Work Tuesday, Double-up Tuesday Night. This is one day of the requirement; You have worked two shifts in day.*)

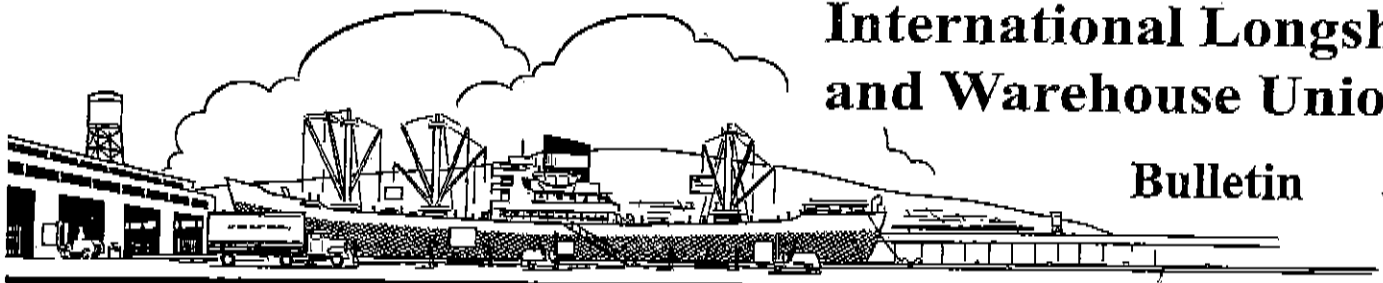

UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION WORK ON ALAMEDA STREET

Beginning next **Monday, August 24, 2026**, Caltrans will begin construction activity on Alameda Street, South of Anaheim Street, which may result in traffic congestion going to and from the ILWU, Local 13 Dispatch Hall over the following weeks. While the road repair work is scheduled to take place mainly in the overnight hours, between 8:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., all Local 13 members should allow extra time to get to and from the Dispatch Hall, safely and on time, as the construction schedule is subject to change.

This work, along with all the other ongoing detour route improvements, are necessary due to the upcoming full closure of the Vincent Thomas Bridge (VTB), beginning on November 1, 2026.

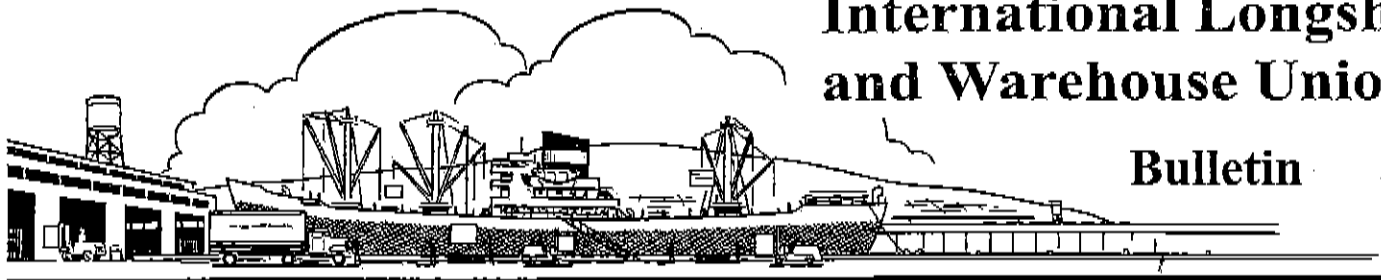

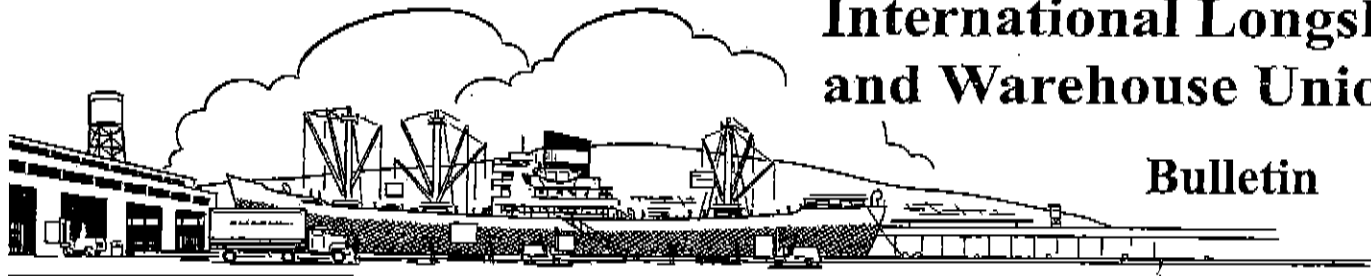
Meat Locker Help and Calling Replacements

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS FOR LOCAL 13 CONSTITUTION

In this upcoming election, members will be asked to vote on twelve (12) amendments to the Local 13 Constitution. Much of the language in the Constitution dates back to the founding of Local 13. In the decades since, the law and Local 13's interpretation of various provisions have undergone many changes. The following proposed amendments aim to reflect this:

1. Article IV(1)(F) – Nomination of Officers

Change To: In order to have his name placed on the ballot and to hold any office or position, each candidate must have been in good standing and must have worked at least one (1) shift a month as a ~~an~~ active Longshoreman in the industry in this Local or have been working for the ILWU for the previous twelve (12) months. The work requirement ~~This is not applicable to men injured in the industry or otherwise disabled during the previous twelve (12) months.~~

Reason for change: Clarification of work requirement and revision to treat industrial and non-industrial disability in the same way.

2. Article V(1)(F) – Election of Officers

Change To: A person cannot be a candidate for more than one paid office or paid position at the same time.

Reason for change: Clarification of existing understanding of the meaning of the language.

3. Article VIII(2) – Vacancy of Salaried Office

Change To: Any Elective Salaried Officer, Employee, or Committeeman who absents himself three (3) consecutive times without sufficient cause from the duties and meeting assigned to him or whose conduct is detrimental to the organization, shall have his position declared vacant by the Presiding Officer and, pending notice and hearing on the charges before the Grievance or Trial Committee, he shall not hold any position in the Local for one (1) year.

Reason for change: To align with legal requirements.

4. Article X(1)(A) – Membership Applications

Change To: Applicants for membership in this Union must be qualified to perform the duties necessary for general longshore work; shall be of good moral character and ~~have no serious physical defects which may prove~~ must not be a hazard to himself or his fellow workers. He must be eighteen (18) years of age and ~~must be eligible to citizenship under the laws of the United States.~~

Reason for change: To align with modern standards of equal treatment.

5. Article X(2) – Membership Applications

Change To: Any officer or agent, or former officer or agent of a Corporation or Association of Employers, ~~or a deputized city, county or special police,~~ or men proven to be members of, or former members of vigilante groups, shall be prohibited to membership in this Union.

Reason for change: To allow former police officers membership.

6. Article XI(1)(A) – Dues, Fines and Assessments

Change To: ~~All fines, assessments or other indebtedness must be paid before your dues will be accepted.~~

Reason for change: To align with legal requirements.

7. Article XI(1)(C) – Dues, Fines and Assessments

Change To: Example – (The delinquent date is the 15th day of the month following the month the dues, fines, assessments or other indebtedness were accrued. In months where the 15th falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or Holiday, the delinquent date will be the first Monday after the 15th of the month.)

Reason for change: Clarification of existing understanding of the meaning of the language.

8. Article XII(1)(A) – Reinstating Members and Withdrawals

Change To: Members wishing a withdrawal card ~~must be paid up to date with their dues, fines, assessments or other indebtedness for the current month and~~ must intend to quit all work under our jurisdiction. Members wishing a withdrawal card are still liable for their dues, fines, assessments or other indebtedness up to the current month of withdrawal.

Reason for change: To align with legal requirements.

9. Article XII(1)(B) – Reinstating Members and Withdrawals

Change To: ~~Those holding withdrawal cards, who do any longshore or waterfront work subject to our jurisdiction, shall be liable to all dues, fines and assessments from the date of issue of withdrawal card.~~

Reason for change: To align with legal requirements.

10. Article XII(1)(F) – Reinstating Members and Withdrawals

Change To: ~~No member shall be given a withdrawal card unless he has been an active member in the Local for the past twelve (12) months.~~

Reason for change: To align with legal requirements.

11. Article XII(1)(G) – Reinstating Members and Withdrawals

Change To: ~~Withdrawals shall not be issued three (3) months prior to date of termination of the longshore agreement.~~

Reason for change: To align with legal requirements.

12. Article XII(1)(H) – Reinstating Members and Withdrawals

Change To: ~~Withdrawals shall not be honored until six (6) months after termination of any strike or lockout.~~

Reason for change: To align with legal requirements.
